Partial Sharing of the Pavilion Facilities with Clanfield Football Club (CFC)

Graham and I recently held a meeting with the Chair and Vice Chair of the CFC to discuss the potential implications for when we share the premises most weekends from September 2022. The ages of the girls and boys coming to play will be up to 14.

The lease agreement entered between Clanfield Parish Council and CBSC requires our Club to enter into a Licence Agreement permitting CFC to use the changing rooms, kitchen, storeroom, and the common parts of the building in connection with football and training at the sports pitches. **The Bowls Pavilion, bowling rinks and surrounding areas are not part of the shared premises.**

The main points from this initial meeting were that our bowls shoes must be kept free of any mud for the protection of the expensive bowling green carpet. To achieve that, children will be asked to remove boots at the back door before entering the corridor and changing rooms.

We are informed that the children won't generally use the changing rooms, but this cannot be ruled out. The disabled toilet in the corridor might be used if a child or parent requires it.

We are also hoping to lay out some basic refreshments near or outside the back door for teas and coffees etc so that CFC has no need to access the kitchen at all. Temporary signs will be put out to direct parents/visitors to the back door for access to the facilities, as well as to the car parking towards the football pitches.

CFC was amenable to our suggestions and we will continue to keep Members informed of developments so that we can all look forward to welcoming CFC in due course.

Ongoing Repairs to the Changing Rooms

Since first opening the Pavilion, we have had issues in both the Ladies and Gents shower areas, where the vinyl has started to lift around the water drainage channels.

After many debates with Barratts and their contractors over the past 2 years, Barratts has finally accepted that the incorrect drainage channels were installed and the vinyl flooring was laid incorrectly. They have agreed to replace both the drains and the vinyl flooring in the shower areas.

Work started on 8 November 2021 and was due to be completed on 16 November 2021. Unfortunately, when the existing drains were removed it was evident there was a more severe problem. Under the vinyl the concrete base was not stable because it had not been mixed correctly and was very wet. It appears the underground waterproof membrane in those areas had not been installed properly allowing water to penetrate. The flooring in the area had to be removed down to the foundation and back to a firm base. Before it can be reinstated it needs to dry out completely to ensure there are no other hidden leaks. When the floor is reinstated each sub layer will need to dry out before the next can be laid.

We are regularly reviewing the situation but the latest estimate is the work may take a further 4 to 6 weeks to complete.

We apologise for the inconvenience this may cause and if anyone has personal items in the changing areas they would like to retrieve please contact Karen Eaton and she will arrange to do this for you.

Review of Heating and Energy Efficient Options at the Pavilion

Graham and I recently met with a Heating & Energy consultant to help us to review the existing building to establish elements of high energy usage and to assess what future improvements might be appropriate and feasible. The overall aim is to have a warm, comfortable, and efficiently heated building.

We are currently studying the report which includes some simple ideas, as well as some that would require capital cost investment. Solar panels and/or an air sourced heat pump would require the wider involvement of the Parish Council, as well as planning permission from EHDC and grant funding. The report will form a helpful basis for engaging with these third parties.
