Chairman's Christmas Message

Greetings to all our members as we come nearer the end of a very successful 2024 in the Club – a year of highs and sadly, some lows. Whilst your committee members will update you on happenings in their particular areas, I would like to update you on two items:

- *The Rink Wall*: You may have noticed that the rink wall near the Bowls Shed has been 'on the move' towards the green, by about an inch in some places. Clanfield Parish Council has agreed to fund the remedial work to reconstruct the footpath and wall, and we have instructed a company to complete the job which will be done over the winter, with minimum disturbance to play.
- The Football Club and potential Pavilion Extension: Now the football club is using the football pitches, the committee needs to explore in what way the Pavilion may need to be altered or extended to provide our additional kitchen and storage requirements, together with any requirements the football club may have. The Management Committee is in discussions with the Parish Council and the football club to determine these requirements and understand how best to provide for them. We will update you as and when we have more details, but this is unlikely to be in the short term.

We were saddened that two of our members, Keith Wiggins and Judith Mohammed, passed away during the year and we expressed our sincere condolences to their families.

I would like to take the opportunity to wish all our members and families, a very happy and pleasant Christmas, and a healthy New Year. I would also like to extend my personal festive good wishes and gratitude to the Management Committee for their hard work and support over the year.

A Cheery Message to All Members – Volunteering and Christmas Presence!

Most of you will be aware we have volunteers who regularly help with the general running of the Club which saves us a great deal of money each year. Apart from stewarding we would like more general help around the Club House both inside and outside from small issues like minor repairs to larger and long-term agreements to regular stewarding. After every occasion in the Club House we need to clear away and tidy up. The benefits of helping out are numerous and getting to know most members and making new friends must rank high on this list. A few of us joined the Club partly to enjoy our magnificent view over the South Downs which is second to none in my view but also to make friends and enjoy the activities.

We will have completed the Christmas decorations, both inside and out, by the time you read this, but please take time to let us have your thoughts on the displays when you get a chance. Suggestions for additional or future displays are welcome.

Look at the notice board and see the Club website for the various opportunities available for your enjoyment over the festivities. It will mean access to an area of the car park and the end of the rink by the affected wall will be restricted until the work is complete, hopefully by mid-February.

Finally, please say a thank you to both **Sue Restell** and **Ruth Newton** when you get a chance. They have both taken over a lot of the rota duties from me. They largely deal with the rota lists and ask for help each week — not an easy task!
