1. SELECTION CRITERIA FOR FRIENDLY MATCHES

However, one of our members has suggested that a Captain and Vice Captain are appointed, and they then select teams for each game based on performance and skill levels. For me this is a step nearer the whole league serious play piece that we have so far avoided but, nevertheless, it is important that we take the majority preference into account ready for next season so please let me know your preference:

A. Yes, continue as we are in 2023.

OR

B. No, I would prefer that only the best players are selected to represent CBSC.

Either way David has asked me to formally accept the Captain's role and we are looking for someone who could also partner on the whole 2023 friendly match programme as Vice-Captain. The Vice-Captain and I will choose the teams for each match using the preferred method that the members have voted for, as detailed above.

These have served us so far, but I have had many players suggest now would be the time to change to a new design and perhaps something that is more representative of our Club Colours/Logo and also perhaps more stylish and comfortable. Also, your views as to whether the shirts should include each player's name on them would be appreciated.
